Year 4 Electives Lead, Southern Medical Program (SMP)

The University of British Columbia, Southern Medical Program (SMP) invites applications for the position of Year 4 Electives Lead. This is a 3 year term appointment, renewable, subject to a satisfactory performance review. The time commitment is 0.2 FTE, equivalent to 1 day per week.

The Southern Medical Program (SMP) is a distributed undergraduate medical education program within the University of British Columbia's Faculty of Medicine. During Year 4 of undergraduate medical education, students from all three UBC Faculty of Medicine sites (Vancouver-Fraser Medical Program, Northern Medical Program, and the Island Medical Program) have the opportunity to do clinical electives throughout British Columbia. There are over 50 different Specialty Electives and 20 Family Electives offered in communities within the Interior. The electives program in the Interior is becoming increasingly popular and well subscribed by UBC students as well as visiting students from other Canadian and International medical schools.

The incumbent will be a MD with a commitment to the development of medical education in the Interior. The incumbent must have sufficient protected time during the working week to fulfill the requirements of this role, there is flexibility regarding meeting times and work completion hours. Applicants must currently hold or be eligible to hold a UBC clinical faculty appointment. The ideal candidate should have knowledge of the MD Undergraduate Program. They will demonstrate excellent organizational and interpersonal skills, as well as proven administrative ability combined with outstanding communication skills.

The Year 4 Electives Lead, SMP, reports to the Regional Associate Dean, Interior and works closely with the Year 4 Leads at the Island Medical Program, Northern Medical Program and Vancouver-Fraser Medical Program to ensure the goals and objectives of this course are met.

The expected start date is March 1st, 2020.
