



Family Practice Lead for MEDD 411/412/421/422, Southern Medical Program (SMP)

The University of British Columbia, Southern Medical Program (SMP) invites applications for the position of Family Practice Lead for MEDD 411/412/421/422 at the SMP. This is a 3 year term appointment, renewable, subject to a satisfactory performance review. The time commitment is 0.4 FTE and the position is based at the Kelowna General Hospital (KGH) Clinical Academic Campus (CAC).

The Family Practice Lead for MEDD 411/412/421/422 (Foundations of Medical Practice 2, Foundations of Medical Practice 3, and Transition into Clinical Education) at SMP will have planning and organizational responsibilities for the SMP family practice components within MEDD 411/412/421/422. The Family Practice Lead works in close collaboration with the MEDD 411/412/421/422 Course Directors; the Family Practice Leads for the Vancouver-Fraser Medical Program (VFMP), Island Medical Program (IMP), and Northern Medical Program (NMP); and the other site-based MEDD 411/412/421/422 course leadership to ensure the goals and objectives of these courses are met.

The Family Practice Lead for MEDD 411/412/421/422 will be a practicing local family physician with a commitment to the development of medical education in the Interior, and an open and flexible approach to teaching within the medical curriculum. The successful candidate will have experience in teaching and student assessment within the SMP and will demonstrate leadership skills, collaborative and participative team building skills, effective interpersonal communication and a commitment to quality and service. Key to success will be attention to detail, high energy, problem-solving capabilities and a respectful communication style.

The Lead is accountable to the Regional Associate Dean, Interior. They will work closely and collaboratively with the Assistant Dean, SMP; SMP administrative leadership; and SMP course and clerkship directors.
