



### Site Director, Integrated Community Clerkship (ICC), Trail, Southern Medical Program (SMP)

The Southern Medical Program (SMP) is a distributed undergraduate medical education program within the University of British Columbia's Faculty of Medicine. In Year 3 of undergraduate medical education, students have the opportunity of gaining broad clinical experience in a variety of clinical settings throughout the Interior. The Trail ICC has been a successful ICC site and has allowed students to learn through an interdisciplinary team approach to medicine.

The Site Director, ICC, Trail, will be a practicing local physician with a commitment to the development and implementation of the SMP ICC Program at Kootenay Boundary Regional Hospital (KBRH). The incumbent will work in close collaboration with the Regional Associate Dean, Interior, ICC Program Director, Vernon, and the ICC Site Directors at the Vancouver Fraser Medical Program (VFMP), the Island Medical Program (IMP), and the Northern Medical Program (NMP) to ensure the goals and objectives of the ICC are met. The Site Director, ICC, Trail will be a member of various curriculum-related committees and ICC planning committees.

This is an administrative role with a three-year term appointment. The time commitment is 0.3 FTE, equivalent to 1.5 days per week. The incumbent must have sufficient protected time during the working week to fulfill the requirements of this role and be prepared for some travel. Applicants must currently hold or be eligible to hold a faculty appointment. A shared Co-Directorship model will be considered in special circumstances.

The site Director is accountable to the Regional Associate Dean, Interior. They will work closely and collaboratively with the Assistant Dean, SMP; SMP administrative leadership; and SMP course and clerkship directors.
